

# Mill Meadows Wildlife Trail



The trail can be divided into three parts. Cold Bath Stream runs parallel to Meadow Road and joins the River Thames beyond the River & Rowing Museum. Wildlife Trail leaflets are available from the Pavilion and the Museum shop at opening times.

## 1. Cold Bath Stream

The banks of this watercourse provide a home for many native plants, such as Pendulous Sedge, with its many tall, hanging tassels, Fool's Watercress, Hops and Common Comfrey.

The stream makes its way through sloping banks which, in places are covered with nettles, brambles and thistles. All of these are good food plants for butterflies and other wildlife.

Very occasionally a Kingfisher is seen along the stream. In earlier years, the stream was home to the nationally endangered Water Vole, 'Ratty' from 'The Wind in the Willows'.

Stepping stones have been placed in the stream to improve access for visitors.
