

Mill Meadows Wildlife Trail

The trail can be divided into three parts. The Grassland Areas cover part of Marsh Meadows and a triangle of land between that and the railway line. Wildlife Trail leaflets are available from the Pavilion and the Museum shop at opening times.

3. Grassland Areas

Several different species of grass are present, some with lovely names like Yorkshire Fog, Meadow Foxtail and Sweet Vernal Grass.



The tall uncut hedges have a wide selection of shrubs and trees, from Dog Roses with their pink blooms in Summer to Hawthorn, Hazel, Oak and Ash.

These provide nesting places for birds in Spring and act as a source of food and shelter for butterflies and countless other insects.



YOU ARE HERE

The wide edges of this area of grassland are left uncut for most of the year to provide a haven for grasshoppers, spiders and butterflies, such as the Marbled White and Meadow Brown.
